New Aloha Stadium Entertainment District Delivery Team. For the delivery of health care services at Maui Regional System Facilities, the governor, with the assistance of the chief executive officer of the corporation, and the regional chief executive officer of the Maui regional system, or their designees, shall negotiate with a private entity to transfer the right and responsibility to manage, operate and otherwise provide health care services at one or more facilities of the Maui regional system, including Maui memorial medical center, Kula hospital and clinic, and Lanai community hospital, to a non-profit management entity whollyowned by the private entity; provided that the private entity

submitted a statement of interest in response to a notice published by the Maui regional system board, inviting private entities to submit statements of interest in acquiring the right and responsibility to manage, operate and otherwise provide healthcare services in one or more of the Maui regional system's facilities.
